

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



# a quickie with LAST DINOSAURS

“an accumulation of four musicians trying to create something different”

That's right, they live! Well four do anyway, in the form of Brisbane-bred Last Dinosaurs. And as if surviving extinction wasn't talented enough, they've picked up guitars, become one of Australia's biggest musical prospects, and are fresh off a national tour with one of the hottest bands in the world, Foster The People.

Don't be fooled by their age though, Last Dinosaurs aren't necessarily the new kids on the block. Despite ranging from 18 to 22, brothers Sean (vocals and rhythm guitar) and Lachlan Caskey (lead guitar), who are joined by friends Sam Gathin-Jones (bass) and Dan Koyama (drums), entered the indie music scene four years ago. Since then the band have only gained popularity, music ability - and possibly some height and facial hair.

The group's debut record, In A Million Years hits the stands this Thursday (March 2), which Sean describes as "an accumulation of four musicians trying to create something different." *Blitz* can safely announce that the boys have succeeded, with a release that displays musical and lyrical maturity beyond their years. Lead singles, 'Zoom' and 'Time And Place' feature quick-fingered catchy riffs, with a catchy drum line to follow.

He describes the album as having, "a lot more groove", confidently adding, "I think that'd be the direction we're headed". It seems like the public are certainly digging that groove, with the singles already having generated a huge buzz on YouTube and Triple J. When asked about where the band comes up with their music and

lyrics, the singer-songwriter stated: "the entire album has come from the farm". Not an assumed atmosphere for the city slickers, but the songwriter was quick to praise their remote location: "We have an awesome hook up with one of our friend's parents who own a farm in northern New South Wales, we go out there to jam out ... focus on songwriting and the music ... because there's literally nothing else for us to do there."

So what's it like being away from home for Sean, who also has his younger brother around? "When we were younger I had to look out for him, but he's 18 now so, more than anything, he probably looks after me."

It's hard to imagine packing up and leaving for a national tour at their age, but Last Dinosaurs are now more than experienced in this field, having supported the likes of Foals, Powderfinger, Lost Valentinos and most recently Foster the People. Sean says he and the band learned a lot from their latest support tour.

"Obviously they're [Foster] one of the biggest groups in the world right now, our musical styles are different but their live performances are something we hope to match."

With an album under their belt and a national tour lined up supported by close friends Millions, be sure to catch Last Dinosaurs as they reach new heights and continue to make their mark on the music world.


