JULIA STONE

The voice that melted many hearts is back with a solo album and taking to the stage – minus Angus

Coming from a musical family on Sydney's Northern Beaches, Julia was, pretty much, born with a guitar in her hand and her brother Angus to sing along with. With a new solo record *By The Horns*, two platinum albums and a Triple J Hottest 100 number one, to the Stone sibling's credit, her sound is still developing. Yet why hasn't the success faded her? Maybe it doesn't get to your head when it comes so naturally. *BLITZ* got in touch with Julia to find out more.

You've always been surrounded by musicians, who's your greatest influence?

My mother, because she has a very different voice to me – it's deep and strong with a lovely vibrato. Singing along with her was the greatest lessons in music I've ever had.

These days you're more well known for singing along with your brother, do you have a favourite song to perform with him?

My favourites are the ones where Angus and I sing in harmony, which we do most on 'Santa Monica Dream' which is always my favourite part of a show. It is such a natural joy to sing in harmony with someone, particularly him; his voice is so lovely to harmonise to.

So how do you decide what songs are best suited to your solo or group work?

I don't sit down and think about it, it's a very natural process. Most of the songs on *By The Horns* I wrote while recording it. How

songs are the most relevant and exciting to play when the studio lina comes around, that's what I do with Angus and it's also what I do by myself.

For *Open the Way*, most of the recording was pretty experimental – done in interesting places like supermarkets and water tanks. How does that compare to working in the studio (as in *By The Horns*)?

Every day's an experiment, and working with producers in the same studio was just another kind of experiment. I love being left so letting someone else make the decisions was fun. It was so liberating, as more than anything else, I could just be a singer.

So would you also use that experimental perspective if you were advising UNSW students who want a career as a singer?
Try not to think of it as a career – that way there's no expectation that it will unfold a certain way. In the end, all that matters when it comes to music is that it makes you feel something. Live your life the way it plays out and don't try to manufacture the life that you think will make you happy. If it happens that you end up making music that lots of people want to hear, great! Or if you end up a yoga teacher in Bangladesh, that's also great! Music will always be important and beautiful in your life.

As will Julia be in ours – keep your ears open for *By The Horns* (check out our review on p18) and if you're lucky enough, get along to see her on Saturday, September 15 @ The Metro. Apparently there's also another album with Angus due later this year...

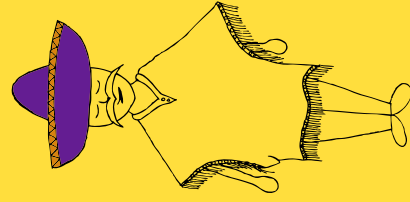


SEMESTER TWO SHENANIGANS

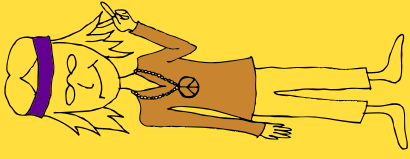
HAPPY BIRTHDAY UNSW

THRILLING THEMES

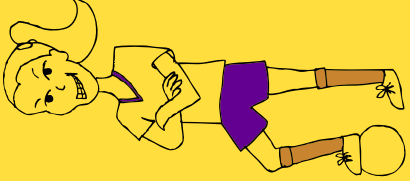
UNSW spices things up in second semester with heaps of themed weeks, meaning you always have something to enjoy on that four hour break between classes.

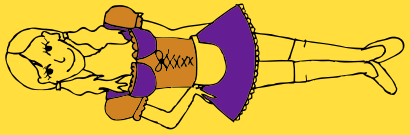


DON'T HATE THE PLAYER, HATE THE GAME
