### Q&A WITH HARRY

Such an inspired name. How'd you pick it?  
We started the band when we were 16 years old and upskirts were all we ever thought about. We never matured so we kept it, although a couple of us can now grow Facial hair.  
How would you describe your sound to someone who hasn't heard it before?  
Like four dudes playing instruments who should have stopped trying a long time ago.  
How do you write your songs?  
Thom is the key song writer in the band, generally he will come up with something, show us his ideas and we construct from there. Otherwise songs can evolve from one riff or guitar sound, and us just jamming on them. When I hear 'She Devil', I think of Gang of Four; Fugazi and even some early Earth. I'd be tempted to call it dance punk but you're way surfer than that... who else are your influences?  
We've been listening to a whole bunch of all kinds of different alternative rock bands, but when it comes down to it, the bands which we draw the most influence from and are generally our favourites: the classic alternative bands like Queens of the Stone Age, Nirvana and The Strokes. We're also heavily influenced by a lot of our friends' bands and other local acts that we play with around Sydney. What's the best things about being in a young band?  
Playing live with three of your best friends is pretty rad, partying after your gigs with all your friends and of course, venue drink tokens.  
How do you want people to feel when they leave your gigs?  
Violated and bruised, yet oddly satisfied.

For Australian musicians, it's almost a rite of passage to base yourself overseas first before coming home with something more to prove. Ladyhawke's just kicked off her Australian and NZ tour, introducing audiences to her catchy and powerful new record *Anxiety*, and I was interested to see if her relocation to the UK and back had influenced her artistic approach and sound.

As was always my plan, I arrived at The Metro just before she whisked onto stage with her electric guitar, skinny black jeans and signature wild blonde hair. Performing to a not quite full house, the set kicked off just past 10pm with her new material, 'Blue Eyes', 'Black, White and Blue' and 'Vaccine' – all of which have infectious hooks. The new tracks sounded a little grungier and a little more rock than her famous early singles, whilst maintaining an easy sing-along pop sensibility. Sadly, the crowd could only be described as tame – perhaps because of Ladyhawke's lack of interaction with the crowd and the rest of the band.

Ladyhawke continued to grind through the set with her screeching vocals and simple yet blistering guitar solos for 'Magic', 'Sunday Drive', 'Back of the Van' and 'Professional Suicide'. It was not until her encore, however, when Ladyhawke finally cracked the hard-to-please crowd. Before she went off stage, she nervously mumbled "Oh this is my last song... but not really my last song..." which was the extent to her interaction with the audience for the night. Somehow that must've done the trick as when she came back for her two encores, 'Paris is Burning' and 'My Delirium' delirious we were! Although it took a while to get there, Ladyhawke brought the house down.





I heard you guys can get pretty crazy too, sometimes.


I guess finishing off Four punchbowls in the space of 15 minutes with seven or eight members is kind of crazy.


