When LA-based Asa Taccone and Matthew Compton hit the stage at Splendour this year as indie-pop act Electric Guest, you could tell they were doing what they love. It was hard to think that something that looked so fun could be much hard work, but a chat with Compton set us straight: no true joy comes without hard work.

You guys have hardly had a break in touring your debut album Mondo since April, is it good to be home?
Oh my God, you have no idea! I was literally daydreaming of the meal that I would eat the second that I got home.

Ha, what was the special meal waiting for you?
I made myself a super healthy kale salad, literally the healthiest thing I could possibly put in my body.

So what's the best thing about being a musician? Surely not the touring...
No, I do it for myself. For me it's important just to make something that I feel I'm excited about. You feel like you're doing something creative and you're doing something to further yourself. I've been lucky enough to go ten years without having any job besides playing music. It's not like I do it for fame or anything like that - I'd still be doing it if no one had ever heard this band.

Would you say those ten years have been a struggle?
I think we've been really lucky. We have a lot of super talented people working with us, but it took us five years to complete this album. People say we've come out of nowhere but we definitely haven't, we've been slaving over this for a very long time.

What advice would you give to students looking to carve out a career as a musician?
Stick with it; it's a very long process. Most people only make music because they want other people to like it, even though it's not necessarily what they're totally enthralled with. A lot of people in LA say they do music but most of their time is spent out talking about how they do music, as opposed to being in a studio trying to get better and that's the wrong approach.

I understand that it's hard and painful, but you have to be doing it literally all time. That's something Asa and I agreed on and bonded over early, we are young people, and if this is what we're going to do with our lives, right now is the time. There can't be anything else in our lives. You have to be strong and obedient, and after a while it shows. You hit this point where you feel like you're understanding what you set out to understand and you're looking for more.

Would you ever take time out from music to pursue other dreams?
I don't even take time out to eat food sometimes - it's really sad! I'm pretty obsessive with music right now, but maybe when my body starts giving out I'll start to think about those things.

Blitz speeds down the highway to the dangerous co-curator of this year's Festival of Dangerous

This weekend, the Festival of Dangerous ideas is taking over the Opera House. With talks on the joy of sin, the pros of genetically engineered humans and the inheritance of sexual perversion, nothing will be safe or sacred, so if you're the type who's easily led astray, you should probably stay away. As UNSW is full of great thinkers, this week we caught up with festival co-curator Ann Mossop to find out just how dangerous ideas can be.

When seeking out speakers, what characteristics are you looking for?
 People with interesting ideas of a dangerous nature! Sometimes you pick a topic and choose the best person for it and sometimes you just come across somebody really extraordinary and think, "We should really get them to come."

In the past, that's led you to invite people from Justice Kirby to Julian Assange. What's the best event you've ever seen at the Festival of Dangerous ideas?

Jonathan Safran Foer talking about eating animals last year was amazing. I also enjoy seeing people with very different views going at it hammer and tong. We had a great session in 2011 called 'Gays and Lesbians Do Not Belong in the Classroom' with Jim Wallace and David Marr. They both had so much passion that I had to sit between them to keep them from tearing one another to pieces.

What's the most dangerous idea that excites you?

Right now, I'm looking at the American programme of drone

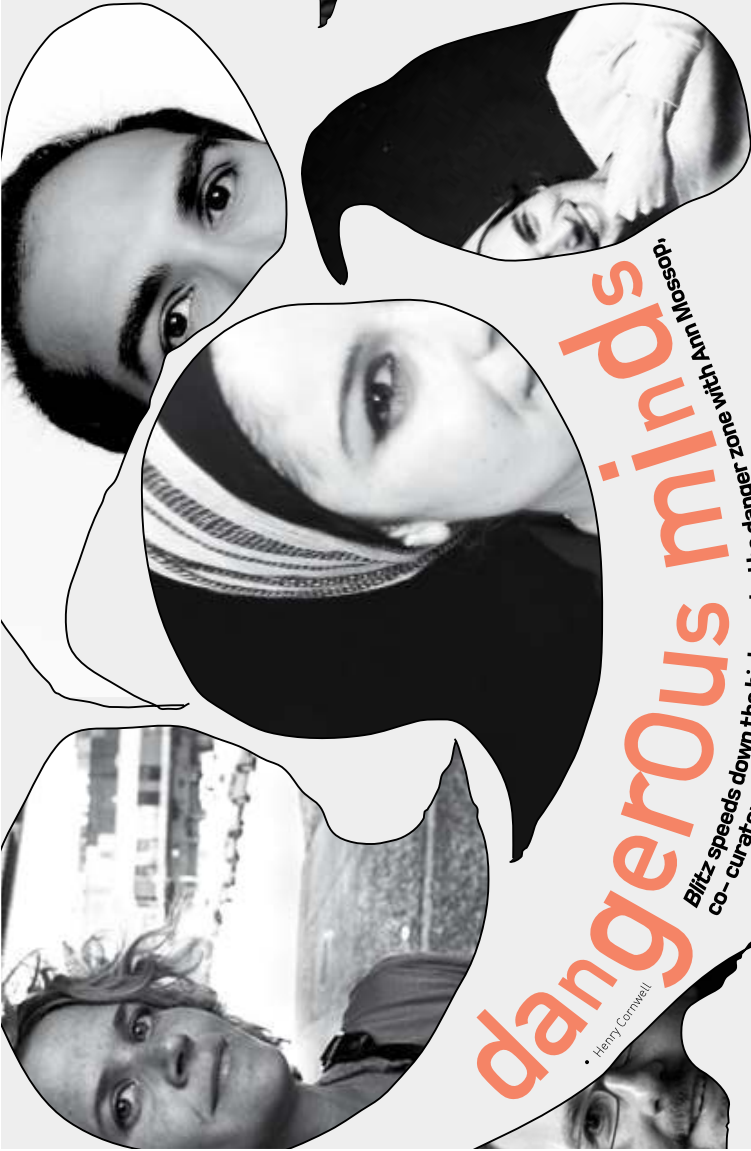
attacks and extrajudicial killings. You have to ask, "who are the real terrorists at the moment?"

There are also two very interesting ideas about mining companies: one is that they should be allowed to dig wherever they want, the other is that they shouldn't be allowed to dig anywhere at all. Gina Reinhardt's advice to everybody to work harder on an even lower minimum wage is particularly dangerous. When you hear that kind of advice coming from Australia's richest person, I think there's some serious conversation that needs to be had about Australia's richest citizens. Why do they give so much less here than their counterparts do in other countries?

Great question. So what shows would you recommend for students this year?

Some of our speakers are quite well known, and you don't need me explaining why it might be interesting to hear them. But there are some really cool people coming to the festival who people may not know - those are the ones that will be great to tell people all about.

It's been a tough year in the life of one of UNSW's most inspiring students, Turia Pitt. Engineering student, Emergency Rescue Service Volunteer, Miss Earth Australia and entrepreneurial fundraiser, known for her contributions to the lives of the needy in Cambodia and Mongolia, Turia Pitt is one of our shining lights.

Competing in Racing the Planet's Kimberley Ultramarathon this time last year, she and four other runners became trapped in a gorge and engulfed by a bushfire. She suffered burns to 60% of her body, and is now half way through a two-year treatment programme that requires her to wear compression bandages 23 hours a day, learn to use prosthetic fingers, and undergo grueling physio and occupational therapy.

the Roundhouse are holding a fundraiser to help cover the costs of her treatment and achieve her dream of surfing again. 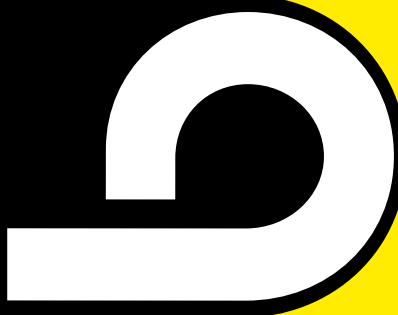

ELECTION REJECTION

Did you vote in the recent Local Government Elections? Did you even know they were on? If not, then you're not alone; only about half of the people eligible to vote in the Sydney Council Election actually showed up! Even accounting for postal and absentee votes, many areas had voting rates as low as 60%.

On top of that, the people who did vote seemed not to take it seriously; some areas had informal voting rates (defaced votes, drawings on the ballot, apparently Barack Obama received a significant amount of votes) as high as 25%!

If you're enrolled to vote and you didn't, you'll probably receive a letter in the next few weeks (depending on whether your council decides to pursue it or not), asking you to offer an excuse as to why you didn't vote, or to pay a \$55 fine. Whatever you do, just don't ignore the letter. If the council doesn't receive a response within 21 days, they'll take other actions against you such as increased fines, or suspending your driver's licence until you pay.

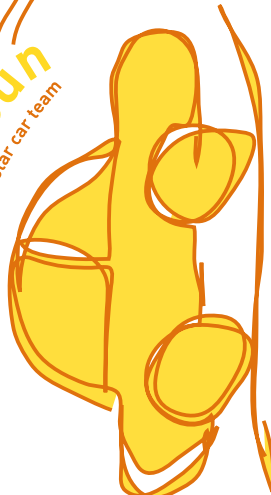

BAIT 3D

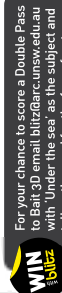
Directed by: Kimble Rendall

For Australia's first ever 3D action movie, this is far from the safe option you'd expect. Drawing inspiration from Jaws, while resting securely in the mould of Snakes on a Plane, this situation thriller is built around the unlikely premise of a supermarket being flooded by a tsunami, whose waters have also brought a pair of hungry 12-foot great white sharks.

This solid cast of young Australian actors, headed by Xavier Samuel (Twilight), A Few Best Men, 2:37) and Sharni Vinson (You're Next, Blue Crush 2, Step Up, 3D), know what a high concept genre film like this requires, and they pull it off with exactly the degree of melodramatic expressions and comic relief you'd want.

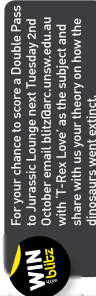
JURASSIC LOUNGE

1. Stock Market

Also their cheese and garlic naan beats sliced bread from home and if you don't mind playing treasure hunt in a sea of bright orange rice, the butter chicken is worth a venture.

5. Sushi Roll

The Japanese are the champions of the cheap and portable lunch, and Sushi Roll provides well. We particularly applauded the 3-rolls-for-\$6 deals at 5pm when they're closing, the risk of illness from dubious late afternoon sushi consumption, adds a little thrill to ordering.
