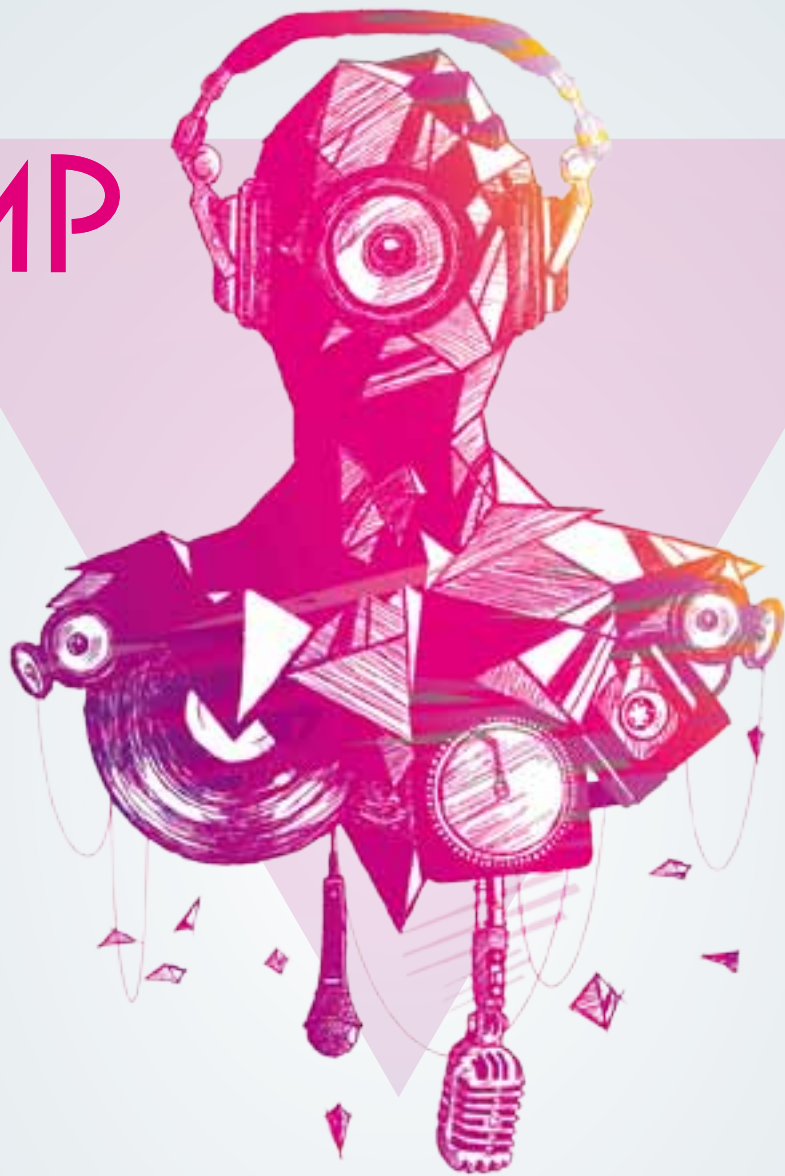

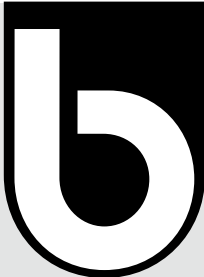

MICHAELA EPSTEIN

TEACH FOR AUSTRALIA UNSW GRAD



Teach For Australia is a not-for-profit organisation that's taking a different approach to educational disadvantage in Australia. They organise for graduates from degrees other than teaching to have six weeks of intensive training, followed by two years of on-the-job training, leading to a Graduate Diploma in Teaching. Participants are placed in disadvantaged areas across Victoria, the ACT and the Northern Territory; there are also plans to bring the program to New South Wales.

Michaela Epstein, a UNSW alumnus with an Honours Degree in Arts and Science is in the third cohort to start the program. She chatted to *Blitz* from Mildura where she's about to finish her first term as a Maths and Politics teacher.

What made you want to become a teacher?

I'd focused on the political choices around education for my thesis, and through that developed a desire to become involved in education. Then the opportunity came up and I thought, "this is a really good chance to get into the industry – to be launched straight into an area where they really need teachers." It's really opened my eyes up to the issues schools are dealing with.

How is it moving to a new community so far from home?

Mildura's beautiful. It's small compared to Sydney but it's not a tiny country town either – there's a lot happening. With school holidays I'll be able to visit friends and family pretty regularly, and I plan to do that this Easter.

Have the local teachers been welcoming?

A number of teachers have gone out of their way to make myself and the other associates feel at home, which has been lovely. The teachers and principals see us for ourselves and what we are: new teachers, passionate about our subject areas, with a real desire to do the best.

What sorts of challenges have you come up against over your first term?

My most challenging class is a Year 10 Maths class, where the boys like to spend much class time throwing paper at one another; many of them want to leave school at the end of the year, so they don't have their hearts in it.

The challenge for me is to make the class so applicable that they feel they'll gain some real skills to bring to whatever it is they want to do next year, whether it's school, an apprenticeship or anything else. But in the same class I've had assignments handed to me to the sound of students saying, "this is the hardest I've ever worked, and I'm proud." It's quite special.

WILD WAYS TO AVOID WORK

Nobody likes work, and the Romans were no exception. But unlike the modern students stuck with 25 contact hours per week, the Ancient Romans had all kinds of ways of getting around it. The chief method was getting other people to do their work for them and in order to make this happen, they'd capture barbarians and turn them into slaves. Pillaging for the glory of Rome was just about their favourite thing to do, so this was a major double-win. But if that wasn't your thing, it was also perfectly legal to sell your children.

Another way the Romans avoided work was to make most days a holiday. They had about 96 holidays per year, and then heaps of other special circumstances when they were legally obliged to party instead of work. For instance, Ancient Roman historian Livy tells us that whenever 'a shower of stones' was reported, a nine-day festival would be ordered in response. And when the Emperor Trajan annexed Transylvania, the Romans partied for 123 days. They also invented the siesta, and I won't sleep until it's brought back as part of Occupational Health and Safety regulations.

FINDING 'THE ONE'

With all that time spent not working, the Romans had plenty of time left for love. But, like us, they often found it difficult to find the right person. Rather than giving up altogether or wasting their time on dead-end dating sites (or "carrier pigeon networks", as they called the internet back in the BC), they'd let 'The Gods' decide for them. At the festival of Lupercalia, single people would get together, throw their names into a hat and skip awkward dates by just marrying the person they were paired with – way less difficult than trying to pick up at a uni party.

PRAISE THE LORD!

These days, those of us who still bother praising deities at all tend to do so sitting down, singing songs and smiling at the old people in the room. The Romans wouldn't have understood that at all. Roman religious festivals were more about slaying animals, bathing in their blood and fashioning loincloths from their skins, and then removing said loincloths and running naked up and down the street.

A real highlight was the festival of Saturnalia. For one week, slaves were treated as equals, people walked around in drag, temples were deliberately vandalised and every night was marked with wife swapping and orgies.

GRUESOME GAMES

Like us, the Romans loved their sport. Just as we head out on the weekend to back our fave League or AFL team, and even dress up and stop studying to watch the Melbourne Cup, so too did the Romans love a bit of *ludi meridiani*, *munera*, and *bestiari* (see below), however the difference was the latter all resulted in death. *Ludi meridiani* involved re-enacting myths in which the protagonists died gruesomely. *Munera* was the standard pre-Rabittohs Russell Crowe-style Gladiator match, and *bestiari* involved pitting loincloth-clad slaves against wild animals.

BATH TIME

The Roman Baths were the place to catch up with mates and nut out the big issues of the day, with at least one public bath in every city, with segregated spas for women. The Romans thought that there was nothing more manly than sitting in a hot, sweaty room full of naked dudes. The baths were also a great spot for getting a casual health check-up, as you can't hide your blemishes without clothes. I'm sure it was perfectly acceptable to grab a brother's boil and say, "mate, I think you should get this checked out." You don't hear about that happening over at the UNSW Gym.

This week's Toga party is a chance to impress people both with your mad physique (as the Toga reveals all) and your grasp of Roman history. Either way you'll be sure to make some new friends and, as you make your way home afterwards, you can proudly think to yourself *veni, vidi, vici* ("I came, I saw, I conquered").

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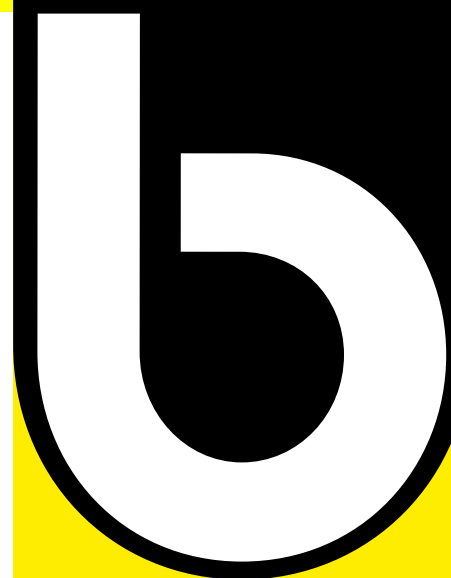

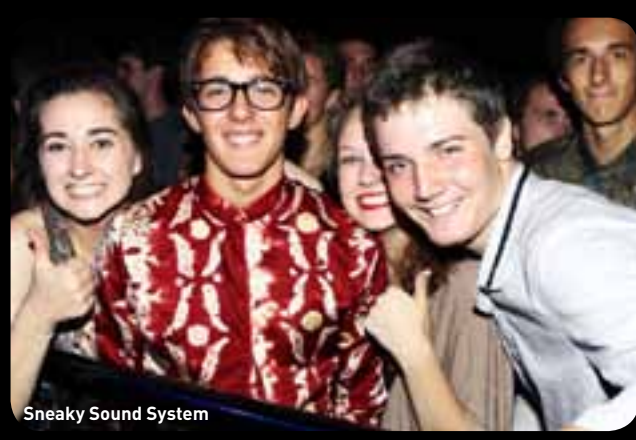

Beard, Wives, Denim

From the flange-soaked opening chord of 'Fantastic Explosion of Time', you know you'll have fun with this album. The wide-ranging and experimental collection of music reflects the relaxed, collective nature of this jovial side-project, held together by Tame Impala's Jay Watson and Nick Allbrook.

If you saw them opening for MGMT last year, you'll instantly recognise their technical skill and psych-rock music-nerd charm. Just like MGMT with *Congratulations*, mainstream success is clearly not what these guys are after with this project.

The songs are drenched in '60s nostalgia reminiscent of The Kinks or The Beatles. Pond has a cobbled-together feeling to them, and often slump to the self-indulgent. Without the luscious, washed-out vocals of Tame Impala's Kevin Parker, this band is clearly a side project. And it's the sort of album you can only release if your other band's already famous.



A DANGEROUS METHOD

In David Cronenberg's new film, *A Dangerous Method*, which is about the birth of psychoanalysis, Freud laments, "experiences like this, however painful, unnecessary and inevitable... without them, how can we know life?"

A Dangerous Method was, at times, a slightly painful experience. This was mostly because the dialogue was really heavy and often confusing. I always wonder how much actors understand of what they are saying or portraying. I had assumed that the three main actors (Michael Fassbender, Keira Knightley and Viggo Mortensen) had adequate experience and skill to convey the complex context and content of the film, but the actors spent more time summarising events rather than portraying them for the audience to interpret. I would have happily sacrificed a spanking scene in order to catch more interactions between Jung and Freud, rather than just hearing that they "spoke for 13 hours".

On the plus side, the acting was incredible and I'm going to buy the soundtrack, as the score added much needed depth to the film. It's not a necessary film to see, but I think *Psych*, *Gender Studies* and English kids will enjoy it.



BEHIND THE BEAUTIFUL FOREVERS

Annawadi is a slum on the fringes of Mumbai's airport; a swampy half acre that is home to over 3000 people. Katherine Boo, winner of a Pulitzer Prize for public service, spent many years living in Annawadi, developing relationships with the protagonists and documenting the events described in the book.

Behind the Beautiful Forevers is centred around the murder of one of the slum's more notorious residents, a disabled woman named One Leg. Abdul, an enterprising Muslim garbage collector, is falsely accused of the crime. The dramatic events and deftly described characters belie that this is a work of non-fiction. Boo uses the ensuing events to explore the complex relationships between the slum inhabitants and the wider community; divisions of religion and caste, the corruption of the police force and the overburdened justice system.

Just from the title of the first release, 'Reverse Cowgirl', you can see the humour will remain the same with the only changes coming in arguably better graphics, and the introduction of funnier characters and more celebrity parodies.

Always having a go at the popular events from around the world, I expect Kony 2012 will be put under a lot of scrutiny in season 16.

With a wide range of comedy sitcoms hitting their later seasons and losing momentum (i.e. *Curb Your Enthusiasm* and *How I Met Your Mother*) fans of the genre mustn't fear, as *South Park* will always deliver.



AUTOLUMINESCENT

This is a beautiful film about Rowland S. Howard, Australia's most influential, yet least acknowledged, guitarist. His pioneering sound was a crucial influence for countless acts, including Sonic Youth and the Yeah Yeah Yeahs. This documentary chronicles his gradual development from a pretentious dandy until his final days as a musician dying at the height of his creativity.

Filming started soon before he was diagnosed with liver cancer, and *Autoluminescent* was released shortly after his death. Though artfully shot, the film allows the cruelty of Howard's tragically ironic end to speak for itself, rather than drowning the viewer in cinematic techniques and celebrity tears. While those who don't know Howard's music may find the documentary a little too long, it will leave music enthusiasts dying know more – particularly about how he developed his sound.

How does a game work exactly?

THE SEEKER

Harry Potter's position - chases down the Snitch, an impartial player with a Golden Snitch attached to their person. If they catch the Snitch, the game ends and they are awarded 30 points. The Snitch/Seeker combo is often the most exciting of any Quidditch game.

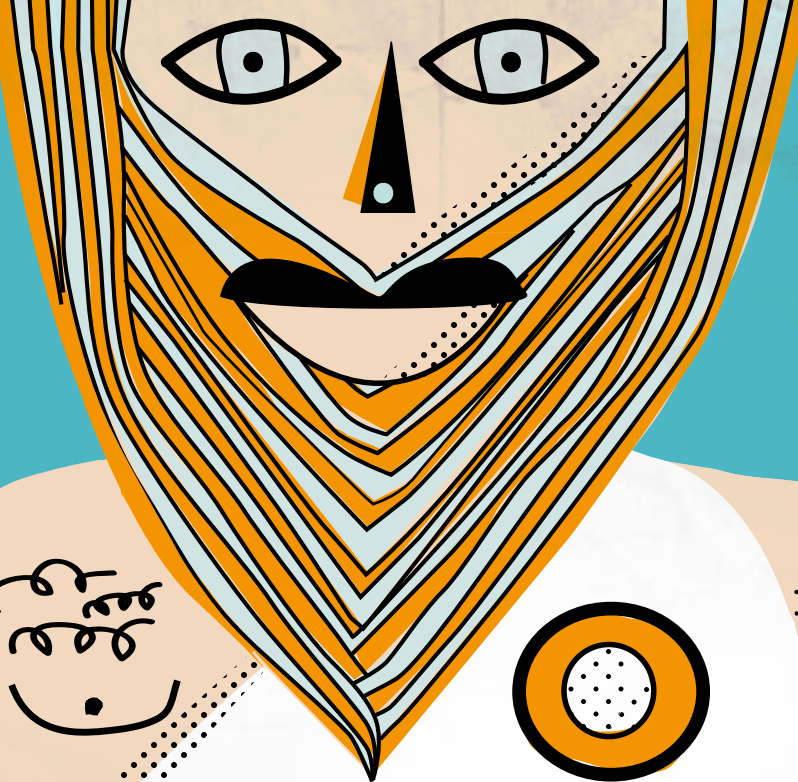
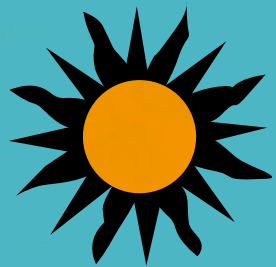
