5. Matters for Discussion

5.1. Housing Campaign at UNSW

The paper was taken as read.

Discussions:

- Housing and high rent continue to be a critical issue for students. Many of the accommodations provided to students are not on-campus.
- The Education Collective is planning to extend the Get-a-Room housing campaign and create a campaign to target UNSW Management, demanding rent decreases and more emergency accommodation for students.
- UNSW has three emergency beds, however, there is a lack of general awareness among students regarding this.
- Emergency housing on-campus is not monitored, therefore it is challenging for students with mental health issues to access them. There needs to be better staffing of the emergency accommodation on-campus.
- The SRC may be invited to student consultations as the University works on housing issues and seeks to increase the amount of scholarships for low SES students. It is important that the SRC makes its demands clear to UNSW.
- It is important that students unionise to create power in fighting against UNSW Management.
- The demands need to highlight the hardships students face as they are expected to work part-time hours to be able to pay living expenses and balance full-time study.
- There is a market for University accommodation. The key is to make the accommodation affordable for low SES students. In the process, the SRC also should be respectful of college students who are able to afford to live there.
- It is important that low SES, regional and international students are all able to receive access to affordable housing. Whilst there are accommodation scholarships for such demographic students, many students are unaware of it.
- There will be an Education Collective organising meeting on 6th June to create a broad campaign and discuss concrete demands. The SRC should fully support the campaign and promote it on social media.
- The SRC should also work to provide recommendations for policy changes to ensure sustainable and long-lasting change.
- The Queer Officers seek to encourage a campaign about crisis accommodation. Regular long-term housing is important.

The General Secretary reminded the SRC that they will be trialling BrightPoll for voting at the next SRC meeting.
